CHAUTAUQUA

Chautauqua, a free, family friendly show set in the early 1900s of Cranbrook is an opportunity to invite theatre goers young and old to perform in or join our audience.

CCT has revived Chautauqua over the past few years. Chautauquas were travelling road shows of entertainment and edification in Canada in the late 1880s through to the late 1920s. They travelled the summers from town to town across the prairies, into the north and west of the country.

A core group of professors, teachers, professional musicians, others made up the Chautauqua team. They might speak about the invention of the telephone or typewriter or that sort of thing. Cultural performances might include a classical piano or violin, or a recitation of classical or contemporary literature.

Local people were encouraged to step up and perform as well. Some of this talent might include playing guitar or banjo, or even the fiddle and spoons. Sometimes local people would perform songs and recite poetry or perform short skits.

CCT's Chautauqua aims to be true to the spirit and intent of the early ones. Chautauqua will fall on a Friday evening this year, June 15th at the Studio. Remember, its free and family friendly! It's a drop-in event. Come and go as you like. Chautauqua runs from 5:30 – 8:30. Come out and have some fun! This is a registered Sam Steele Society event.
