

The Fighting Days are Coming!

Thankfully not to our streets, but to the stage of Cranbrook Community Theatre. Tickets can now be purchased for this important Canadian play, written by Wendy Lill and Directed by Melodie Hull.

It is 1910. Women are chattel and our boys are about to march off into the meat grinder that is The Great War. These are The Fighting Days.

The story is of real life suffragette Francis Marion Beynon,

played by Jelena Jensen. Newly released from her religious father's tyranny and off to the big city of Winnipeg to live with her sister Lily, portrayed by newcomer Allison Platt, Francis experiences all of the new century's limitations while the drums of war slowly increase volume.

But, not loud enough to drown out the cries of EQUALITY, DEMOCRACY and **VOTES** FOR WOMEN screamed passionately by Francis' close friend and suffragette Nellie McClung. Candice Fisk has the daunting role of bringing this Canadian icon to the spotlight. While the only male role in the play, the traditional newspaperman and Francis' nemesis/love interest McNair, is brought to life with humour and the embarrassing values of the time by Nathaniel Leigh.

The cast is rounded out by six more talented ladies portraying prairie women of the time, whose performances move us with first-hand knowledge of the hardships our foremothers endured to create this country.

The show runs February 7, 8, 13, 14, 15, 16, 19, 20, 21 and 22nd at The Studio Stage Door 11 - 11th Ave South, Cranbrook. All show times are 7:30PM, except the matinee on Sunday February 16th which starts at 2:00PM.

Never Too Old to be Green

The Studio/Stage Door finished off 2019 with a much brighter shade of green and smaller carbon footprint thanks to partnerships with several organizations. In the latest project, finished in December, the roof's structure, ventilation and insulation was improved and soffits repaired.

All of the upgrades achieved in the past year will help to sustain the heritage venue for years to come. Utility costs have already shown a noticeable decrease.

Together with financial assistance from their partners; Heritage BC, the Columbia Basin Trust (CBT), BC Hydro, Community Foundations of the Kootenay Rockies (CFKR) and the City of Cranbrook, significant upgrades have enabled the 111year-old heritage venue to be viable for many decades to come. The building's new shade of 'green' is a great example of what can be done.

The most recent energy efficient accomplishments began with secured grant funding through Heritage BC's Built Heritage program supported by the Columbia Basin Trust. The investment paid for added insulation and ventilation in the roof as well as repairs to soffit that was critically damaged by past winter ice buildup.

To keep the project feasible Sandor Rental Equipment Ltd. generously reduced the cost of a Genie Boom rental and Cranbrook City Council voted to help fund structural repairs to the roof of the building.

This phase of the Studio/ Stage Door upgrades was completed in December 2019 just in time for Old Man Winter's arrival.

Acting Mayor, Mike Peabody, offered this acknowledgement:

"The City is very pleased to have approved funding for the Studio/Stage Door improvements to the roof structure.

"Through collaboration between the City, Cranbrook Community Theatre and the financial contribution from Heritage BC, the Studio/ Stage Door's green footprint has been significantly improved.

"The City appreciates the Cranbrook Community Theatre for their commitment to the Studio/Stage Door and the excellent entertainment provided to the citizens of Cranbrook and area."

In summer of 2019, the Stage Door lobby and concession received new windows and insulation in the walls through the CBT's Arts, Culture and Venues program. By August, the entire building was also retrofitted with LED lighting thanks to BC Hydro and Community Foundations of the Kootenay Rockies (CFKR), which has resulted in an annual estimated savings of 13,000 kilowatt hours (or \$1500).

All renovations and retrofits were done with excellence by local contractors: Munter Design and Build, Big Horn Electrical, Columbia Electrical, BriKat Contracting Services and High "R" Expectations.

In 2019 Cranbrook Community Theatre Society members and partners have invested close to \$190,000 into the building for a total of almost one million dollars since they became stewards of the heritage prop-



erty in 1974.

Hearts Will Keep Beating at Studio/Stage Door

A partnership with Cranbrook Sunrise Rotary has resulted in the purchase of a ZOLL fully automated electronic defibrillator (A.E.D.) for the Studio/ Stage Door. The CCT applied for and was successful in receiving the funding from the Sunrise Rotary Club in the late fall of 2019 and the A.E.D. was purchased and installed in December. The chosen unit

activates and guides the user with step by step audio directions on how to use it to save someone's life.

"We hope no one ever has to use it, but we're very glad to have it here in case that happens," stated Peter Schalk, CCT President.

"The Cranbrook Sunrise Rotary Club is pleased to sup-


